1. Change of procedure regarding further processing for priority certificates submitted after the deadline

The Institute is changing its procedure regarding further processing for union and exhibition priority claims when a deadline has been missed (Art. 41, para. 4, lit. b, Trademark Law). Under the new regulation, the applicant has the possibility for further processing even when the priority certificate is submitted late. 2. European Patent Organisation: Re-election of the president of the Administrative Council

The Administrative Council of the European Patent Organisation once again elected Roland Grossenbacher, Director of the Swiss Federal Institute of Intellectual Property, as president for a third term of three years on December 13, 2005. 3. First section of the patent law revision approved by parliament

The National Council accepted the federal decree for the approval of the two national treaties on the reform of the European patent system (the revised European Patent Convention - EPC – and the optional language agreement) at its December 15, 2005 session

The Institute has completely revised the guidelines for the substantive examination for national patent applications. The revised guidelines (in German and French:

http://www.ige.ch/E/jurinfo/j100.shtm#a02) will go into effect January 1, 2006. As of that date, all pending patent applications will be examined according to the new guidelines.

5. Free Trade Agreement signed between EFTA and Korea

Federal Counsellor Joseph Deiss and EFTA colleagues from Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway signed a conclusive free trade agreement (<u>http://www.ige.ch/E/jurinfo/documents/j110703e.pdf</u>) between EFTA and the Republic of Korea on December 15, 2005 while in Hong Kong. The agreement is scheduled to come into force after the required ratification on July 1, 2006.
