## 1. Expert conference on "The future of copyright – a balancing of interests or a paradigm shift" on 2 March 2010 in Bern

The Swiss Federal Institute of Intellectual Property (IPI) is organising together with the Swiss Forum of Communications Law (SF-FS) a seminar on "The future of copyright – a balancing of interests or a paradigm shift?".

Traditionally, there exists varying lines of reasoning for copyright. In the Anglo-American region in particular, it is seen as a way of promoting culture, whereas legal protection in the continental-European region is understood as a consequence of the act of creating. These justifications are today being confronted with the perception that copyright prevents new works rather than fostering their creation. Many circles consider legal protection within the context of the internet as an anachronism and therefore react by not observing it. Nevertheless, copyright protection in the western world is experiencing a steady expansion albeit in the form of extended terms of copyright. Where is this leading to? Are the usual justifications regarding copyright still appropriate today? Would it be advisable to either completely or partially replace or exchange traditional copyright with other systems? Could, for example, a general 'culture tax' cause a balance of interests? In the first part of the seminar, the fundamental issues will be looked at and potential solutions presented. Following this, stakeholders from the entertainment industry and the academic sector will state their views. Why not discuss your experiences too?
