Legal experts will meet from 30 November to 3 December 2010 in Sydney for a technical meeting in order to undertake the legal verification of the finalised text

Training

Course: "Intellectual Property Law: A practice-oriented course" – November 09, 16 and 23 2011 in Lausanne

For the third time, the Federal Institute of Intellectual Property (IPI) is offering a three day module in French for clerical staff responsible for the administrative procedures regarding protective rights. The course is intended for clerical staff in trademark and patent law firms as well as those working in the IP sections of their firms or industries. Based on demand, the module includes all practical aspects of filing, registering and transferring protective rights, nationally and internationally. It offers participants a complete and well-founded introduction into the various protective rights areas. Course: "Patents, Trade Marks & Co. " – February, May and August 2011 in Bern

In this introduction, participants will familiarise themselves with the basic terms, the different rights and obligations as well as the various methods of filing for trade marks, patents and designs. In addition, you will gain insight into the tasks and services of the Institute of Intellectual Property. This basic knowledge course is particularly aimed at those without any special prior knowledge of intellectual property.

Module: “A basic knowledge of protective rights” in spring and autumn of 2011 in Bern

This year, the Swiss Federal Institute of Intellectual Property (IPI) will be offering the module “Basic knowledge of protective rights” on two occasions. The module is comprised of six half-day courses that can be individually booked. The course is aimed at all those who have little or no previous knowledge of intellectual property rights and are interested in acquiring a basic knowledge of this field. This course is different to the module “Intellectual Property Law: a practice-orientated course” in that the main focus is not on the technical aspects of the filing and registering of various protective rights but rather the function, purpose and scope of trademark, patent, design and copyright as well as their meaning for SMEs.
