 periods the country will benefit from as an LDC.
- Capitalising on expertise that has been built under the Swiss-Vietnamese IPR cooperation project since 2001.
- Enhancing South-to-South cooperation and creating synergies with the cooperation project between Vietnam and Lao PDR.

Project specific objectives

- · Assisting in modernising Lao's IPR system.
- Capitalising on the expertise that was built under the Swiss-Vietnamese IP cooperation since 2000.
- Enhancing cooperation between regional partners and creating synergies with the cooperation project between Vietnam and Lao PDR.

The main outcomes:

- The LIPP contributed significantly to the completion of the legal framework in the field of IPR in key areas required by the TRIPS Agreement.
- Key staff members of DIP familiarised themselves with the operation of an IP office specific to their respective functions.
- Awareness of 150 officials outside the core IP administration was raised.
- IP aspects were integrated into business development services.
- Current IP courses at universities were improved and adapted to the specific local context. Awareness on the importance of IPR issues was increased beyond the legal faculties.
